### Did you know:

A typical family consumes 182 gallons of soda, 29 gallons of juice, 104 gallons of milk, and 26 gallons of bottled water a year. That's a lot of containers -- make sure they're recycled!

The energy saved from recycling one glass bottle can run a 100-watt light bulb for four hours. It also causes 20% less air pollution and 50% less water pollution than when a new bottle is made from raw materials.

## Recyclable at a time!!

DO RECYCLE	HOW TO RECYCLE	DON'T RECYCLE
Newspapers & Magazines	Put in recycle bin. If it looks like rain, remember, wet paper CANNOT be recycled.	Phone books, junk mail, or other paper products.
<b>PLASTIC BOTTLES</b> Food & beverage bottles marked with a #1 or #2 on the bottom	Rinse and remove the lids, place in your recycle bin.	Plastic wrap, bags, toys, or other types of bottles such as those used for automotive or other hazardous materials.
<b>ALUMINUM &amp; METAL CANS</b> Food and beverage cans	Rinse and place in recycle bin. It is helpful if you remove the paper labels.	Scrap metal, paint cans, aerosol cans, automotive product cans, pie tins or disposable aluminum plates.
<b>GLASS BOTTLES</b> Clear, brown and green glass food and beverage bottles.	Rinse and remove the lids. Place in recycle bin. It is helpful if you remove the paper labels.	Light bulbs, plate glass, auto glass, tempered glass, mirrors, ceramics or any glass that is not a food or beverage bottle.

All recyclables can be commingled together in the recycle bin
